An Example of Our Mission

Forced non-therapeutic genital cutting of minors violates the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, as well as several other United Nations covenants (Zavales, 1995, p. 11), including:

- The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), adopted by Canada in 1948.
- The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) ratified by Canada in December 1991.
- The Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms, enacted by Canada in 1982.

CHHRP is working to defend male, female, and intersex children's right to bodily integrity through awareness, education, and strategic communications promoting adherence to these laws and treaties.

What is Involved as an Advisory Board Member?
